Jesus: Has had popular times, but once his church grew to 5000 he managed to offend them all, and then his church dwindled down to twelve people. Seldom stays in one place very long. And, of course, he's single!

This just reminds me that there are no perfect people. However, God can work through anyone – even people we'd never expect – even people like you and me!

Pastor and scholar Eugene Peterson once wrote, “God, it turns out, does not require good people in order to do good work. As one medieval saying has it,

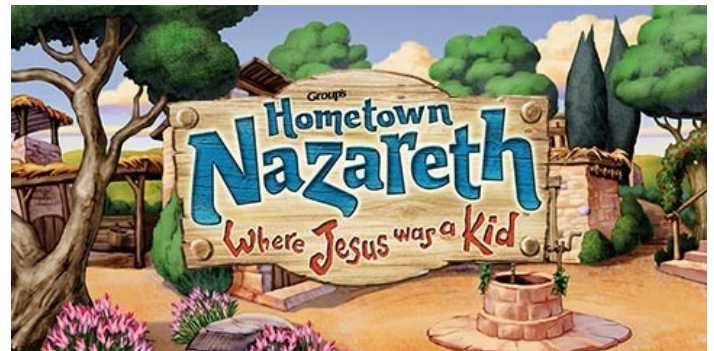

Summary of Stated Session Minutes from May 11, 2015

- A period of continuing education was presented by Elder Sharon Hartsell on Roberts Rules of Order.
- The Financial Report was submitted for the month of April 2015. The bequest from the Elizabeth Smith estate was received in the amount of \$35,268.39. A letter of gratitude has been delivered and the money will temporarily remain in a reserve fund to backstop mortgage loan payments if necessary.
- A **motion** from the Worship Ministry to create a budget change to cover expenses was **defeated**/postponed indefinitely. Worship will prepare a more detailed accounting of projected expenses and submit at the next Stated meeting.
- Elder Sharon Hartsell provided an update report on the work of Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Geneva is on-line with the Mission Information Form (MIF) with about 64 responses from persons seeking the pastor position being received. These will be reviewed for possible candidates.
- A **motion** was made and **approved** to purchase assisted hearing devices for use in the sanctuary.
- There will be a Called meeting of Session on May 24 at 9:55 am to receive John Booth into Geneva membership.
- A **motion** was made and **approved** to have the following guest preachers: Rev. Amy Camp on 07/26; Fran Meza on 08/02; and Robert McCary on 08/09.



June 14-20, twelve Geneva Youth will trek to Montreat Conference Center in beautiful Montreat, NC. There will be two programs running simultaneously for our youth:

Completed Grades 6-7: Montreat Clubs

The Club's program is a recreation and fellowship experience! A typical week in Clubs consists of swimming, paddle-boating, music, water games, devotions, arts and crafts, wilderness education, and evening worship. There will be lots of active outdoor games (such as scavenger hunts, tag, and other high-energy creative games) and indoor games (such as pool and table tennis), as well as participating in music, dancing, tennis (bring non-marking tennis shoes), hikes, and rock-hopping (bring old closed-toe shoes).

Completed Grades 8-12: Montreat Youth Conference

Montreat Youth Conference clears space for encountering God, discovering and deepening a vibrant and durable faith in Jesus Christ, and hearing an invitation to make a personal commitment to embody the love, justice and righteousness of Christ.

The mission of the 2015 Montreat Youth Conference is to provide a safe environment where youth will be challenged and empowered to hear their own voice, share their perspective, and to ask their questions. Together, we will hear and live the holy promise of God's love in a real and supportive community of acceptance!

The Montreat Youth Conference is designed for high school students, entering freshmen through graduated seniors, and their adult leaders. It is a unique gathering of young people from all over the country for a week of study, worship, and recreation. Activities include morning energizers, music, keynote, small group meetings, afternoon recreation activities, and evening worship.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

In the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), there are four special offerings recognized as extremely important to the mission of the church, which have significance beyond regular mission giving. They are: One Great Hour of Sharing Offering, Pentecost Offering, Peacemaking Offering, and Christmas Joy Offering. They are “authorized” special offerings, but our session decides which offerings to receive.

This month we will provide information about **One Great Hour of Sharing Offering**. It is an ecumenical offering that begun in 1949 by nine denominations to offer an opportunity to share God’s love with a world in need. Its roots were in the radio-broadcasts introduced immediately after World War II to secure funds to assist in the rebuilding of Europe. “Recognizing that the hope we have in Christ is lived out in our love for one another, we respond with gifts that help our brothers and sisters around the world find hope for a better future” (The Four Churchwide Offerings of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A))



The gifts of Presbyterians across the country enable Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Committee on Self-Development of People, and the Presbyterian Hunger Program to respond to people’s immediate and long-term needs. These monies are used for response to disasters, to help in refugee resettlement, and to aid in community development across the United States and around the world.

The Presbyterian Disaster Assistance receives 36% of the undesignated portion of One Great Hour of Sharing, and Self-Development of People and the Presbyterian Hunger Program each receive 32%.

Most congregations receive this offering on Palm Sunday or Easter Sunday. Some congregations have chosen to receive the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering throughout the Lenten season.

We will share information about the other three offerings throughout the year. Stewardship and Mission will work together to recommend which program/programs we will support.
